#### Item No. 3: Items for Ratification

## a) Proposal to Conduct Special Exam for B. Tech Students of Pass Out Batches

The proposal of the APC to conduct Supplementary Examination for final year students having backlog in the 7th & 8th Semester was approved by the Senate in its XVIth Meeting, dated 15th of Dec, 2018 vide resolution number R9(a)/Senate XVI/18. Many B.Tech students of pass out batches were having one or two backlogs in other semesters also. The grievance of the students were put forward to the authority stating that few of them are placed in good companies in which they could join only after clearing all the courses.

In this context, the APC, in its meeting held on 21st of June, 2019 recommended to conduct Special Exam instead of Supplementary Exam for pass out batch, B. Tech students, with backlog course in any semester. The detailed proposal described below was approved by the Chairman, Senate and was implemented w.e.f July, 2019.

9(a)/SENATEXVI/18: The Senate Resolved to Approve Supplementary Exam for Final year students having backlogs in 7th and 8th Semester.	1) Special Exam will be only for B. Normally, one can do the registration of maximum 5 (Five) backlog courses excluding 7th & 8th Semester courses.  2) Under this provision, supplementary exam may not be conducted for final year B.Tech students. Rather, special exam will be conducted for those having backlog courses in various semesters including 7th & 8th Semesters.  3) Students may register provided he/she had acquired mid-term and internal assessment marks for the backlog courses.  4) If any student is having prerequisite as backlog, he/she may be allowed to register for the courses simultaneously. However, the course clearance will be considered only if prerequisite course is cleared. Under this

	kind of registration, students have to submit an undertaking in the Academic Section.  5) For registration of backlog courses under special exam, students have to pay Rs. 5,000/- (General / OBC) and Rs. 3,000/- (SC / ST) for each course.
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The Senate was requested to ratify the proposal.

#### b) Branch Change Report of 2018 Batch, B.Tech Students

B. Tech students were allowed to apply for Branch Change after completion of 2<sup>nd</sup> Semester provided they have earned a CGPA of 8.5 and above. Academic Section had received 16 applications this year and the Branch Change Selection Committee scrutinized the applications as per norms and recommended the list to Chairman, Senate for approval. Dr. G. Satheesh Reddy, Chairman, DRDO has consented to be the Chief Guest in the 6th Convocation of the Institute which is scheduled to be held on 28th September, 2019 (Saturday). Dr. G. Satheesh Reddy is well known for his significant contribution towards indigenous design, development & deployment of diversified Missiles & Strategic System, Guided Weapons, and Avionics technologies and for the sustained efforts in advancement of Aerospace technologies & Industries in India. It is also worth mentioning that Dr Reddy was the Chief Architect of **Mission Mukti**. Under his leadership, the DRDO demonstrated the technical capability to neutralize a live satellite in space for which India proudly become fourth nation in the world. He has contributed significantly towards formulation of many national R&D policies and conceptualized modalities for Promoting Innovative Research.

It is a matter of pride and privilege for the Institute to recommend his name for awarding the honorary Ph.D Degree (D.Litt) during the aforesaid event. Detailed CV was also presented as **Annexure-5**.

The Senate deliberated on the matter and recommended to place it before the BoG for approval.

As per the existing academic norms, the student who fails to satisfy the condition of eligibility for award of degree certificate within the maximum prescribed duration (no. of semesters) for the programme shall leave the programme.

The Senate was requested for appropriate decision on the list as presented. However, it was recommended that the HoDs and Faculty Advisors may be requested to counsel the students.

#### Item No.9: Proposal for Enhancement of Ph.D Thesis Submission Fee

It is proposed to increase the thesis submission fee to Rs. 10,000/- only as expenditure towards Thesis examination by two examiners and conduct of Thesis defence incurs a substantial amount.

#### Item No.11: Proposals for Ph.D Sponsored (Part Time) Programme

The following items are proposed to incorporate under Ph.D (Sponsored Part Time) Programme:

#### a) Co-Supervisor for Ph.D Sponsored (Part-Time) Programme:

It is proposed that a student enrolled into Ph.D. Sponsored (Part-Time) Programme must choose a Co-Supervisor from his/her parent organization or reputed Institute nearer to his/her working place. However, in case the student is unable to find a suitable Co-supervisor, his/her Supervisor may recommend a Co-Supervisor from a reputed Institution that may be beneficial for the scholar to carry out the research work. The

process of proposing a Co-supervisor shall be followed as specified in R7 (b)/SENATE-XVIII/19.

#### b) Semester Registration Process for Ph. D Sponsored (Part-Time) Category:

It is proposed that scholars enrolled into Ph.D. Sponsored (Part-Time) Programme must be physically present during Semester Registration till the completion of Ph.D. Registration. However, after completion of Ph.D Registration, a scholar may opt to send the relevant signed scanned copies to their respective Supervisors who in turn may submit the signed documents to the Academic Section.

#### c) Progress Seminar for Ph.D Sponsored (Part -Time) Category:

It is proposed that the scholars after Ph.D registration under this category shall follow the same procedure as like Full Time Ph.D Scholars and be physically present in the Institute for the Progress Seminar.

The Senate was requested to approve the above proposals as presented.

R11/SENATE-XIX/19: The Senate Resolved to Approve the proposals under Ph.D. Sponsored (Part Time) Programme as proposed above. It was further Recommended that the due date for semester registration may be relaxed for the Ph.D Sponsored (Part -Time) Category after completion of course work and the scholars are required to be present in the Institute at least once in six months.

- Attending Conference/Workshop/Training Programme will require pre-approval from the Authority and must be forwarded by the supervisor/advisor of the Ph.D Scholar through HoD.(Refer to Form-XVI)
- Financial Support for attending Conference/Workshop/Training Programme by Ph.D Scholars is limited to a maximum ceiling amount of Rs.50,000/- only, upon submission of bills.
- Scholars are encouraged to get funding from different funding agency for International Conference.

The Senate was requested to approve the proposal as presented. After deliberation, the Senate decided that there shall be no limitation on the number of Conference/Workshop/Training Programme, etc. However, the maximum ceiling amount shall be restricted to ₹. 1,00,000/- only during the entire Ph.D Programme, subject to a maximum amount of ₹. 50,000/- only per event.
