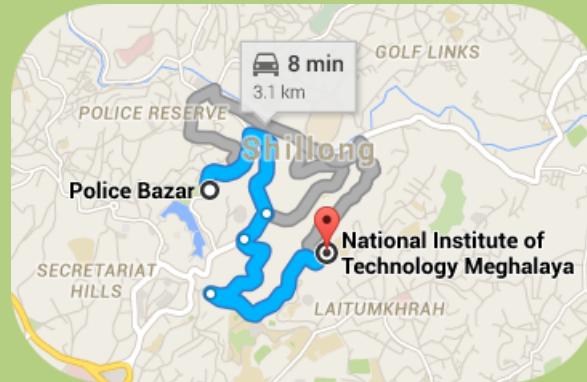
### How to Reach

**Address:** National Institute of Technology Meghalaya, Bijni Complex, Laitumkrah, Shillong - 793003, Meghalaya, India.

**How to Reach Shillong by Air:** To reach Shillong by Air one will have to take a flight to Gopinath Bordoloi Airport, Guwahati, Assam. From there one can reach Shillong in four hours in a hired Taxi (Rs.2000/- per car, approx.) /Shared Taxi (Rs. 500/- per passenger, approx.). Direct flights are also available from Kolkata to Shillong.

**How to Reach Shillong by Rail:** The nearest railway station is Guwahati Railway Station. From the railway station, one can travel by bus or shared taxi (Rs. 150/- to Rs. 300/- per passenger) to Shillong. It takes about 3 hours to reach Shillong.

After reaching Shillong (Police Bazar), one can hire local taxi to reach the campus at Bijni Complex, Laitumkrah.
