a)	Whether any assessment has been conducted regarding the challenges faced in implementing the multiple entry-exit system in higher education, and if so, the details thereof; write a response for NIT Meghalaya.	As of now, no significant challenges have been encountered in the implementation of the Multiple Entry and Exit System (MEES) at NIT Meghalaya.
b)	The measures taken to address the concerns raised by stakeholders such as a lack of standardization in transfer mechanism, ambiguity/vagueness and integration challenges.	To address concerns raised by stakeholders—such as lack of standardization in the transfer mechanism, ambiguity in processes, and integration challenges—NIT Meghalaya has taken several proactive measures. The institute has implemented the Academic Bank of Credits (ABC) system to facilitate transparent and standardized credit transfers. Clear internal guidelines have been established to reduce ambiguity, and a dedicated academic coordination team provides support for student mobility and re-entry processes. NIT Meghalaya has also successfully enabled student transfers to institutions like IIT Hyderabad, IIT Madras, and NIT Manipur, reflecting effective inter-institutional coordination and integration.
c)	The progress made in implementing the academic bank of Credits system, including the number of universities that have fully adopted the ABC.	100 Percent
d)	The expected timeline/dates for universal adoption of the ABC in higher education?	Not applicable, as ABC is already implemented in NIT Meghalaya.
