At the outset, the Chairman, Senate welcomed the members and the special invitees to the thirty sixth meeting of the Senate. Thereafter, the agenda items of the day were taken up.

## Item No. 1: Confirmation of Minutes of the $X_{X X V}{ }^{\text {th }}$ Meeting of the Senate of NIT Meghalaya held on 07.11.2023.

The Thirty-Fifth meeting of the Senate of the Institute was held on 07.11.2023 in the Conference Room of the Institute through hybrid mode (online and offline). The minutes of the meeting were circulated amongst the Senate members for their comments/observations.

R1/SENATE-XXXVI/24: The Senate Resolved to Confirm the minutes of the $X X X V^{\text {th }}$ Senate Meeting held on 07 ${ }^{\text {th }}$ Nov 2023.

## Item No. 2: Action Taken Report on the decisions of the XXXV ${ }^{\text {th }}$ meeting of the Senate.

The actions taken on the decisions of the XXXVth Meeting of the Senate were presented during the meeting and the Senate members noted the actions taken by the Institute.

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## Items for Approval

## Item No. 3: Recommendations from XXXIst APC Meeting.

## 3.1) Minor Degree in Sports Engineering.

The Senate welcomed and appreciated the proposal on introducing the minor degree in Sports Engineering proposed by ME Dept. The Senate was apprised of the future scope and the industry requirements along with other related aspects of Sports Engineering.

The Senate discussed course syllabi in detail and the following observations/suggestions have been made:

- The Department may revise the syllabi for all courses. While submitting the detailed course curriculum for the proposed minor degree in Sports engineering, the syllabi and course structure of the existing courses at various institutes in India and abroad may be included for discussion.
- CFD may be replaced by the simulation and modelling in sports engineering from the syllabus of course code ME 361.
- The provisions to visit the SAI (Sports Authority of India) may also be introduced in one of the course syllabi.

R(3.1)/SENATE-XXXVI/24: The Senate Resolved to Approve the Minor Degree in Sport Engineering to be offered by the ME Dept and Advised that revised syllabi to be placed before Senate after incorporating the noted suggestions/observations.

## 3.2) Duration of Institute fellowship for eligible Ph.D Scholars.

The Senate was informed about the present guidelines of the Institute on the Ph.D fellowship duration, which is till the time of thesis submission or 5 years from the date of enrolment, whichever is earlier. In this regard, the recommendations of the APC (Academic Programme Committee) to extend the fellowship duration was placed for discussion.

After a detailed deliberation, it has been decided to extend the fellowship support to the eligible Ph.D Scholars for a period of three months from the date of thesis submission*, or till the date of defense, or till five years from the date of enrolment, whichever is earlier.

[^1]R(3.2)/SENATE-XXXVI/24: The Senate Resolved to Approve the extension in the Institute fellowship as proposed above.

## Item No. 4: Group Medical Insurance Scheme for Students.

The Senate was informed about the approval of the BoG to provide the Group Medical Insurance Scheme (GMIS) for the Students with a total basic coverage of Rs. 2 lakhs only
to the students, with a condition that the total annual premium amount of the scheme shall be collected from the students only.

The Senate discussed the matter at length and suggested to keep it mandatory for all Indian Students and optional for international students. It has also been mentioned that the Institute may collect some more quotations based on the EOI (Expression of Interest) before finalising the annual premium amount for the student which will be applicable from AY 2024-25.

R4/SENATE-XXXVI/24: The Senate Advised to include Medical Insurance premium in the Fee Structure from Aacademic Year 2024-25. However, the annual premium amount to the students may be finalised based on inviting few more quotations through EOI.

## Item No. 5: Long Term Internship.

The Senate was informed about the Two B.Tech students, Ms. Divyasree Dev, bearing Roll No. B20CS022 and Mr. Amal Shibu, bearing Roll No. B20CS036. Who have received offer of a long-term internship of 6 months (Jan to June 2024) from Morgan Stanley and Hugosave, Hyderabad, respectively.

It was also informed that this matter related to the long-term internship was placed before the Department Academic Committee (DAC) of the Computer Science Department and the committee had observed that the internship opportunity is superior and the work to be carried out is in-line with the major project being assigned to the students with a fair scope in terms of continuing the job at the organization.

After a detailed discussion, it has been decided that the department may suggest both the students to enrol in the equivalent course offered by the NPTEL or Swayam or MOOC as per the course requirement of $8^{\text {th }}$ semester.
Also, the concerned department needs to identify a coordinator to assist the students in choosing equivalent courses and will monitor the activities of the students at different stage of the course like mid-term and end-term exams, etc.

The other responsibilities of the coordinators will be related to the mapping of course and providing the grades to the Academic Section.

R5/SENATE-XXXVI/24: The Senate is Resolved to Approve the long-term internship request submitted by Ms. Divyasree Dev B20CS022 and Mr. Amal Shibu B20CSO36 subject to the condition of enrolment in the equivalent courses offered by Swayam/NPTEL/MOOC as per the $8^{\text {th }}$ semester requirement. Also, the CSE Department is advised to assign a coordinator to monitor the different activities of both the students.

## Item No. 6: Matter related to the Backlogs and financial constraints in paying the Institute fee of two international students.

The matter related to the two international students named Mr. Sree Niloy Kumar Roy, B19CS035 and Mr. Tusar Das, B19EC030 was placed before the Senate, in connection to their backlog courses and financial constraints in paying the Institute fees.

The Senate noted both the cases as presented. After a detailed deliberation, it was mentioned that the international students may not be considered at par with the Indian students in terms of the fee structure but by considering the financial difficulties faced by

Mr. Sree Niloy Kumar Roy, B19CS035 one semester part wavier was permitted and backlog course registration related matter was advised to discussed at department level.

On the other hand, Senate requested to present more information related to Mr. Tusar Das, B19EC030, before reaching to a conclusion.

R6/SENATE-XXXVI/24: The Senate is Resolved to Approve the one semester part fee waiver to Mr. Sree Niloy Kumar Roy, B19CS035 and requested to present for more information related to Mr. Tusar Das, B19CS035. Further the Senate Advised the concerned department to provide program completion plan to these students so that they can complete the program at the earliest.

It was also noted by the Senate that each Academic Department shall have a Board of Studies with the function and responsibility related to the framing, reviewing and updating the content of various courses from time to time, also introducing new courses of study/programme etc.

## Item No. 9: Conversion of Full time Scholar to Part Time Category.

The Senate was apprised of the category change of Mr. Vasujeet Singh, P19ME007 from Full Time to Part-Time with the approval of the Chairman, Senate on the recommendations of the Departmental Research Committee (DRC) as he fulfilled the norms associated category conversion in the Ph. D regulations.
